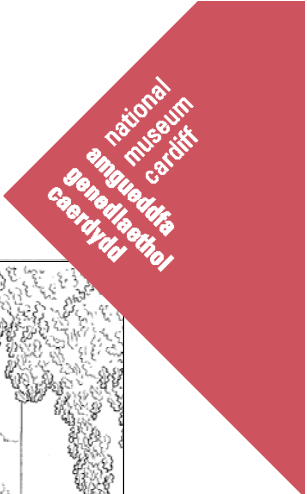

# A Year in the Life of an Oak Tree



## Oakwood in spring and summer

Squirrels, foxes and badgers sometimes make their homes in or under the oak tree.

Insects, like bees, go to the flowers.

Birds eat the insects on the tree.

Moss grows on the damp side of the tree trunk.

There are many holes in the tree trunk. Sometimes animals and insects live in these holes.

## Oakwood in autumn and winter

After the summer, the leaves turn yellow and brown. The leaves fall off the tree.

The oak tree has acorns. Many years ago, people made flour from acorns. Now deer, small animals and birds eat acorns.
